### Burglary and Housebreaking.

Adelaide, S.A.—On the 13th ult., between 1 and 6 a.m., the dwelling house of Solomon Rosengarten, at Hindley Street West, Adelaide, was feloniously entered by a back window, and a glass show-case, containing the following property, stolen from the shop:  $-\mathbf{A}$  gold necklet and locket, set with a diamond, the necklet is tape-like and about  $\frac{1}{4}$  in. wide; eight gold fancy brooches, some set with pearls, others with diamonds; four gold chased bracelets, about 1/2 in. width, one set with pearls, one with rubies, and one with diamonds; a gold snake ring, set with diamonds and rubies; two gold snake rings, with small diamonds as eyes; a gold signet ring, set with green stone (like three rings combined); a gold signet ring, with Masonic emblem (in enamel) on it; six gold signet rings; forty-one gold rings, consisting of wedding, keeper, and dress rings; five silver pendants (figure of a man); five stone pendants (various). gold mounted; a gent's gold Albert (similar to four chains in one); a gent's gold chain, curb pattern; ten gold coins; a twenty-franc piece; thirteen annas; three twenty-mark pieces, two mounted as pendants; four ten-mark pieces; one ten-franc piece; a Japanese coin; about thirty large silver coins—Mexican, Japanese, and American dollars, Italian lires; a Belgian coin, dated 1793, and cracked in the centre; and several German thalers, one has on it two heads—Emperor William and Empress Augusta; about one hundred silver coins of various countries; about thirty jubilee threepenny pieces; a jubilee sixpence, shilling, and half-crown; a set of three oxidised gold and silver lockets; three pairs of gold sleeve-links; several gold bars, swivels, and rings for repairing jewellery; several gold spring rings and silver sleeve links; fifty silver brooches of various patterns; several silver and gold lockets; a quantity of broken gold; ten gold scarf pins, one set with an opal; several silver scarf pins; and a moonstone set in silver; one 9-carat single gold albert, small round links, has a small oblong silver gilt pendant with the ten commandments in Hebrew on it; one gent's 18-carat gold ring, set with large opal, claw setting; one silver sovereign case, old, has been battered and straightened out; one silver circular medallion, has "Dr. Martin Luther" and dates on one side in German, on the obverse side has head of Luther; one and a half dozen small gold 9-carat studs, some plain and some figured; two gold nuggets, one weighs 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>dwts., the other 4<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>dwts.; one four-shilling piece, dated 1888; one German dollar, with head of King of Bavaria on one side and figure of an angel on obverse side; a number of silver coin brooches, made of rupees, two shilling pieces, shillings, and jubilee coins; a second-hand brooch, made of three small silver Indian coins; one brooch made of a shilling, one side polished and intialled. The glass showcase and a quantity of other jewellery (not previously described) was found on a vacant block of land at the back of complainant's premises on the after-noon of the 13th ult.—(C. 468).—O.C.  $\frac{15}{96}$ .
