Circuiar Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. 20 The Commissioner has to draw the C.O. 29. The Commissioner has to draw the attention of the Police throughout the Colony to the frequent recurrence of charges of "Obstructing and resisting Police in the performance of their duty." The Commissioner wishes to discourage the practice. The Police are not justified in taking any one into custody without being able to prove some specific act by which the law has been broken. No Constable should deprive anyone of his liberty for words only, and language however violent towards the Police ought not to be noticed. The Police are particularly cautioned not to answer angrily or enter into any cautioned not to answer angrily or enter into any altercation, and to remember that a Constable who allows himself to be irritated by any language whatsoever shows that he has not a commanding temper, which is absolutely necessary.

Inspectors or other Officers on duty are to examine strictly all cases of this sort brought before them, and upon every occasion to explain to the Constable the necessity for discretion and forbearance at all times.

In cases of affrays in the street or of assaults upon the Police, attempts to rescue or obstruction in the performance of duty, it is not desirable that the Police should take persons into custody at the time if they are known and can be dealt with by summons or be apprehended on warrant. This, summons or be apprehended on warrant. however, does not apply to those cases in which it is necessary to take persons into custody in order to put an end to a disturbance or prevent acts of violence being committed.

Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. $\frac{2}{97}$.—Whenever any member of the Force has occasion to hire a conveyance he must ascertain the cost of same and see that the legal fare only is charged or paid. When an excess fare is charged for detention or any other cause, it must be explained. If not satisfactorily accounted for, the excess will have to be paid by the member of the Force incurring the charge.

Members of the Force incurring any expense for the conveyance of a prisoner to the lockup are required to report the amount to the officer prosecuting in court before the case is heard, so that the item may be included in the costs against the prisoner. In the event of his neglecting to do this the member of the Force concerned will be called upon to pay the amount.

When the police have occasion to convey any sick or injured person to the hospital or elsewhere, they must see that the cost of conveyance is defrayed by such person or his relations. Only when the individual so conveyed is destitute and without friends will the cost be paid by the Government.

Any member of the Force neglecting to report the hire of any conveyance he has used in the performance of his duty will have to pay such hire himself.


