CIRCULAR.]

Aborigines Department, Perth, 1st May, 1898.

The care and protection of the Aborigines having now devolved upon the Government, it is considered part of the public duty of Resident Magistrates, Resident Medical Officers, and Police Officers, to assist in every way in promoting the welfare of the Natives, and in providing relief to the aged, infirm, and side due regard being relief to the aged, and sick, due regard being given to the practice of strict economy.

In order to carry out these measures it is desirable that monthly lists should be furnished to the Aborigines Department, giving, as far as possible, in-formation as to the names, sex, ages, and condition of the Natives to whom relief has been given, care being taken that, as a general rule, no able-bodied Natives who can provide for their own maintenance should receive rations.

Accounts should be rendered monthly, certified by a Resident Magistrate, a Government Medical Officer, or a Police Officer.
