Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. 34.—When any person found to be insane is committed to the Lunatic Asylum at Fremantle, the police are required, before incurring the expense of his conveyance, to ascertain whether he or his friends are in a position to pay the same. If he or they have sufficient means to pay, the cost of conveyance of the patient and his police escort should be collected from them.

Any member of the force who issues requisitions or ticket orders for passages or fares which could have been borne by the lumatic or his friends, will be required to refund the amount of expenditure improperly cast upon the Government, unless he can show that he has not neglected to make proper inquiries in the matter.
