POLICE DISTRICTS.

PLANTAGENET.

Bounded on the South by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the East by the East boundary of the Colony; on the West and North by the Frankland River upwards from its North to its junction with the Gordon River; thence North-North-Westerly to the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarrup Rivers, and onward to the junction of the Murray and Hotham Rivers; thence
