

UREN, MALCOLM JOHN LEGGOE (1900-1973)

Malcolm Uren, newspaperman, writer and historian, was born in Adelaide on January 7, 1900 and came to Perth as a boy. He was educated at Perth Modern School and the University of Western Australia. He joined *The West Australian* as a reporter in 1920 and remained with WA Newspapers for the rest of his working life.

Amongst his editorial positions were: editor of *The Western Mail* (1941-53), *The Broadcaster* (1942-53) and of the women's colour magazine *Milady* (1948-52) before becoming magazine editor. From 1953 to 1965 he was assistant to the managing editor. On his retirement in 1965 he was awarded the OBE. He carried out much original research over a wide range of Western Australian history. For his work on the history of the Abrolhos Islands from the time of the Dutch navigators, on which he based his first book *Sailormen's Ghosts* (1940), he was made a fellow of the Royal Geographical Society in 1945. He had a talent for turning historical research into popular books. They included, *Waterless Horizons*, (1941), (jointly with Robert Stephens), the story of the explorer Edward John Eyre; *Land looking West* (1948) about Governor James Stirling; *Glint of Gold* (1949) about the Western Australian goldfields and based on the recollections of CM Harris; *Treasure Lies Buried Here* about ship wrecks off the Western Australia coast and *Pioneer Pastoralist* (1951), the story of Ernest Lee Steere. He also was very successful in writing very readable institutional histories and his commissioned histories included: *Trinders Pioneers for Fremantle shipbrokers* (1940), *A Thousand Men at War*, the story of the 2/16 Battalion AIF (1959), *Let there be Light and Heat and Power for Fremantle Gas and Coke Co* (1960), *Sails on the Swan*, the History of the Royal Perth Yacht Club (1966), *Golfing at Yokine for the Western Australian Golf Club* (1967), *The House of Parker for the legal firm of Parker and Parker* (1970), *The College on the Hill*, History of Scotch College (1970), *From the Cloisters to Wembley Downs*, History of Hale School (1972), *History of Melville from Bushland to Expanding Metropolis for the Melville City Council* (1972), *Servant of the State*, history of the Main Roads Department, with F. Patrick (published in 1976 after his death). Malcolm Uren also wrote at least two full length manuscripts which were never published, one on Alexander Collie (with Robert Stephens) and the other on the history of the City of Perth. He made a number of radio broadcasts on historical topics and with Alexander Turner wrote the script for *The Stirling Story*, a radio series in 14 episodes about the founding of Western Australia, which was broadcast in 1950.

He wrote regularly on historical topics for *The Western Mail*, *The West Australian*, *The Daily News* and *The Sunday Times* under a variety of nom de plumes including *Cygnnet*, *Kangar*, *Sandgroper* and (with Robert Stephens) *Murs*. He was also responsible for the popular long running "Westraliana" series in the *Western Mail* and later in its successor *The Countryman* where the fruits of many of his historical researches were made public. Along with fellow journalists Paul Hasluck and Ivor Birtwistle, he was a founding member of the Western Australian Historical Society. In 1945 he was

associated with the formation of the Archive branch of the State Library. In 1966-68 he worked for the Western Australian Tourist Development Authority to help boost the historical attractions of Coolgardie and Kalgoorlie for tourism.

During the later years of the War Uren was a war correspondent in the South West Pacific, South East Asia and Europe (1944-45) and in 1944 he helped to establish more vigorous British information services in Australia to counter the extensive American influence at that time. During the 1962 Empire and Commonwealth Games in Perth he was the principal organiser of the Press, radio and television coverage of the Games. He also organised for WA Newspapers two Australian Press tours of the North-West of Western Australia that set the scene for the mineral boom of the 1960s.
