

## HAGENAUER (also HAGENAUER) FAMILY

Friedrich August Hagenauer (1829-1909), Moravian missionary, was born on 10 March 1829 at Hohenleuben, Saxony, of Lutheran parents. He married Christiana Louisa Knobloch, a missionary from Saxony on 15 June 1861 at St Paul's Church, Melbourne and the couple had nine children. Louisa died on 23 October 1917. Their seventh child, Ellen Grace, married Ernest Albert Le Souef on 20 April 1899. (see MN 1391).

In August 1863 some 2356 acres (953 ha) were secured at Lake Wellington on the River Avon. The Hagenauer's moved to this reserve calling it Ramahyuck (also Ramahjuck). For the Moravian Board in Saxony, Friedrich Hagenauer travelled in 1885 to North Queensland investigating Aboriginal needs and his report led to new government reserves and the Mapoon mission.

1 July 1889 Friedrich Hagenauer became acting secretary and general inspector for the board at a salary of £450. He resigned as secretary in 1906 and died aged 80 at Lake Tyers on 28 November 1909.

The papers in this collection (ACC 4370A/632-638) were inherited by Ellen Grace Le Souef, nee Hagenauer after the death of her parents and were received with the Le Souef papers. Papers pertaining to Ellen Grace after her marriage can be found in MN 1391, Le Souef Family papers
