

**ALEXANDER, Fred, 1899-1996**

Fred Alexander was born in Victoria on 12 April 1899 and died in Western Australia in 1996. He was educated at the University of Melbourne and Oxford University. In 1924 he was appointed Assistant Lecturer at the University of Western Australia and there he remained until his retirement in 1965. From 1931 until 1965 he was Head of the Department of History (UWA). Fred Alexander was also director of Adult Education (UWA), founder of the Festival of Perth, and involved in the establishment of the Australian Elizabethan Theatre Trust. He played a major part in securing for Western Australia an efficient public library system and served for decades as Chairman of the State Library Board.
