BASTIAN, WARWICK SHAW (Bishop of Albany)

Warwick Shaw Bastian was born on 4 December 1914, the son of Thomas Albert and Florence Gertrude (nee Shaw). He was secretary of Big Bell Gold Mines Ltd, Cue, from 1935 until he resigned to receive theological training at St Barnabas College, Adelaide, from 1941 to 1943. He was ordained as Deacon in the Anglican Diocese of Perth in December 1943 and installed as Archdeacon of Albany in 1968. He died on 4 October 1979.
