

STATHAM-DREW, Pamela and WANN, Susan

Pamela Statham-Drew was a lecturer in economic history at the University of Western Australia for 42 years. She has written a number of well-known books on Australian history, including a biography of James Stirling. Following her retirement from teaching in 2006, she acted as President of the Historical Records Rescue Consortium Committee, which was awarded grants to assist the Battye Library with preservation of historical items.

Susan Wann is an experienced researcher and archivist, with a special interest in Subiaco history. She has a certificate in Museum Studies from Edith Cowan University. In 2010 she founded the Wembley Ware Society, collecting and promoting items manufactured at the Australian Fine China factory in Hay Street, and was Chairman of the Society from 2012 until 2013.

The collection consists of their research notes on P.A. Latour (sometimes spelled Lautour).
