

HALLIE STOW FAMILY

The collection tells the story of the Paterson, Stow and Shellam families and their migration in the 19th century to Western Australia (Patersons) and South Australia (Stows and Shellams). The considerable contributions of the three families in spheres such as the judiciary, government, pastoralism, the church, literature, banking and medicine are chronicled. Also included is significant information about associated families through marriage – among them, the McLarty, Wyatt, MacGeorge, Plank, Jowett, Sabine, Garran and Bray families.

There is extensive material on forbears namely, the Halcros and Johnstons from the Orkney Islands, Scotland and Canada (Paterson) and the Epes and Randolphs from the United Kingdom and United States of America (Stow). The American connection includes possible descent from Pocahontas and Virginian families, with Thomas Jefferson as a confirmed relative.

Paterson Family

Nicol Robertson Paterson from Stromness arrived in Western Australia around 1840 and lived in Fremantle where he was involved in many business enterprises such as flour milling, the shipping trade and hotelkeeping. In 1856 he purchased Creaton Estate at Pinjarra, where he raised sheep and cattle, managed orchards and vineyards and established himself as a person of prominence in the Pinjarra area. The careers of two of his sons, William and George were successfully associated with pastoral industry. William Paterson, was a member of the WA Legislative Council for the Murray District from 1889-1895 and was the founding manager of the WA Agricultural Bank, (later the Rural & Industries Bank of Western Australia), a position he held until his death in 1920. Another son Charles became a land surveyor and played a major role in designing Perth's drainage and sewerage systems. He was also a member of the Perth City Council.

William Paterson married Susannah Sarah Chidlow, daughter of William Chidlow, an early pioneer of Northam. One of their children was Hallie Margaret who married Robert Norman Stow. Robert Stow was the third son of Augustine Stow and grandson of Quinton Stow and left Adelaide, where he had been born and raised, for Western Australia around 1894. Hallie and Norman had two daughters – Norah and Sheila. Norah married Herbert William Shellam and their children were Geoffrey and Margaret. Geoffrey Shellam married Fiona Stanley and they had two daughters, Hallie and Tiffany. Margaret married Charles Harper with whom she had two daughters, Georgina and Alexandra. Sheila married James Plank later in life.

Stow Family

Thomas Quinton Stow arrived in South Australia in 1837 and founded the first Congregational Church in Adelaide. He was the first chairman of the Congregational Union of South Australia in 1850 and was appointed to the first board of education and served on many other public committees. When he died, he was mourned by the whole city – parliament and banks closed for the occasion. Stow Memorial Church in Flinders Street became his best known memorial. Three of his four sons, [Randolph Isham](#), Jefferson Pickman and Augustine also made their mark in South

Australia in the legal field and as members of the Legislative Assembly of South Australia. Hence, much of the material about the Stows relates to South Australia. Further information on these prominent South Australians can be found in the “Dictionary of Australian Biography”.

There is some interesting material in the collection about the author, Julian Randolph Stow who was the great-grandson of Randolph Isham Stow and the grandson of Frances Leslie Stow. The latter, moved from Adelaide to Western Australia in 1903 and was the Crown solicitor and Commissioner of Titles in Western Australia. His son Cedric was Randolph Stow’s father.

Shellam Family

James Henry Shellam arrived in Australia in 1883 after 31 years in Mauritius and settled in Adelaide. He was originally from England. His son William Frederick Shellam, moved to Western Australia in 1896 and was in Coolgardie and later in York as manager of the W.A. Bank from 1905-1923. He finished his banking career in Midland. He married Florence Isabel Wyatt, daughter of George Francis Wyatt and Catherine Turner MacGeorge and they had three children – Florence Elise (Girlie), Herbert William and Dorothy Leonie. Herbert William married Norah Stow. Herbert was also a banker and worked in Western Australia and Victoria. After Norah’s death in 1980, he married, Helen Sabine. Girlie married John Isgar (no children) and Dorothy Leonie married John Jowett (children Ian and Rosemary)

MacGeorge Family

Catherine Turner, daughter of Robert Forsyth MacGeorge married George Francis Wyatt
The MacGeorge material largely relates to Adelaide. Robert Forsyth MacGeorge built Urrbrae, a historic home in Adelaide, Alexander MacGeorge had another historic home, Glenburnie and James MacGeorge was an architect of note in Adelaide and designed the historic home, St. Andrews

Historic Houses

The archive also contains useful material on a number of historic houses:

Creaton (home of Robert Nicol Paterson in Pinjarra. (Now a ruin, but documented by the State Heritage Office). Geoffrey Shellam hoped to purchase and thereby return part of the Creaton Estate to his family, but was unsuccessful in his attempt.

Stromness (Cottesloe/MPA 164 OSMAN Park). Large house built in 1897 for William and Susannah Paterson when they moved to Perth from Whitby Falls. It was situated on the corner of Keane (now Monument) Street and St. Leonards Street and was a hub of social life in the early 20th century when the Paterson children were teenagers and young adults. At the end of World War 1, Stromness was used as a hospital to accommodate ex-servicemen with a psychiatric illness until 1928. The house was demolished in the late 1960’s and a block of units bearing the name Stromness was constructed on the site.

Edenvale and Liveringa (Pinjarra). Associated with the McLarty family who were a prominent pioneering family in the Murray District and a prominent family in Western Australian politics for nearly 70 years. Gladys Paterson, a daughter of William and Susannah Paterson and sister of Hallie Stow (nee Paterson) married Donald McLarty. Geoffrey Shellam played an important role in ensuring these homesteads were protected from demolition.

The material in this collection has largely been researched and preserved by Hallie Stow (nee Paterson), Sheila Plank (nee Paterson), Geoffrey Shellam, Herbert William Shellam and Florence Elise Isgar (nee Shellam)
