### LITERACY MATTERS: STATE LIBRARY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA LITERACY STRATEGY 2017

**ACTION PLAN: 2018 – 2023** 

Literacy Matters is a ten-year strategy to coordinate the work of the State Library of Western Australia with its partners and supporters to improve literacy for all Western Australians. This *Action Plan 2018-2023* has been developed through The Literacy Alliance, a collaboration of cross sector organisations responsible for the provision of literacy programs and services to Western Australians. It sets goals and outcomes for the next five years towards the vision that all Western Australians have the literacy they need for living and learning. Literacy is defined as, "the ability to understand, evaluate, use and engage with written text to participate in society, to achieve one's goals, and to develop one's knowledge and potential" (*Literacy Matters*, page 5). It includes digital, family and adult literacy. The Literacy Alliance will implement the *Action Plan* and measure ongoing improvement in literacy through the development of an evaluation framework.

## GOAL 1: All Western Australians are aware of the value of literacy in opening up lifelong potential

### We will:

- Provide opportunities for individuals and families to celebrate literacy, learning and the joy of reading;
- Remove the stigma associated with difficulties reading, writing and numeracy;
- Foster positive attitudes to encourage individuals to seek support; and
- Promote the role of libraries across the State in developing and enhancing literacy for life.

## GOAL 2: All Western Australians have the opportunity to improve their literacy

## We will:

- Create an alliance of key organisations and community leaders across sectors that can collaborate to improve literacy;
- Develop and implement a five year action plan with meaningful indicators that measure improvements in literacy outcomes;
- Collaborate with community, volunteer, government and non-government organisations to support local community-led literacy initiatives;
- Work with EAL/D speakers and communities to provide meaningful and engaging literacy services for all ages;
- Improve the confidence of parents to assist in the development of early literacy skills for their children;
- Continually review programs using evidence based research with community input.

- Support formal and informal literacy programs in community and workplace settings, providing different pathways for people to achieve their literacy goals.
