


Why do we take photos? What does your family take photos of?



Can you remember the last photo taken of you? Draw a picture to recreate the


photo, in the space provided. What was happening in the photo?




FAMILY

exhibition that you think best demonstrates something moving. Paste a copy of that photo in the space provided, then draw lines on the picture to show the direction of that movement.



What types of transport can you find photographs of in the exhibition?








Why do you think Izzy's photos are important? What have you learnt about life in the past, by looking at his photos?


