

Legal Deposit in Western Australia

Information for Western Australian Authors and Publishers

Legal Deposit:

The State Library of Western Australia is the legal deposit library for Western Australian publications.

The *Legal Deposit Act 2012* was passed in May 2012. This Act covers print, audio-visual and digital material, including works published on the Internet. The Legal Deposit Regulations 2013, covering print and other physical items, come into force on January 1st, 2014. These Regulations will be extended to include Internet (online) publications the near future.

The Act applies to material published in WA, published by a person who is resident in WA, or whose principal place of business is in WA.

A publication is any work that has been made available to the public. A publication can be in any format: a book, newspaper, journal, pamphlet, map, printed music, film, CD, DVD, computer disc or other device.

Please contact us if you have any questions about what needs to be deposited.

Publications need to be deposited with the State Library within 30 days of publication.

We encourage the donation of a second copy of your publication – the first copy is archival, the second is an access copy.

If you would prefer to be paid for the second copy please let us know and if we require a second copy our agent will purchase it on our behalf. If your publication is also available in digital form, we would prefer to collect a digital copy as the second copy. Digital publications should be deposited through the National edeposit (NED) portal ned.gov.au

Legal Deposit to the National Library and in other Australian States

Publishers in all Australian jurisdictions are required to deposit print and electronic publications with the National Library of Australia nla.gov.au/legal-deposit in accordance with the *Copyright Act 1968*.

If both formats are available, electronic is preferred. The National Library does not collect audio-visual material.

Please send items for the National Library directly to them, the State Library WA does not forward items to the National library.

Internet and Online publications

Until the Act and Regulations are extended to Internet (online) publications, the Library encourages deposit of Western Australia digital publications in the spirit of Legal Deposit through the National edeposit (NED) portal ned.gov.au

Deposit through NED will also fulfil your national legal deposit obligations.

National edeposit (NED) service is a collaborative initiative of Australian National and state and territory libraries for the capture, preservation and discovery of published electronic material across Australia. Copies for Public Libraries

The State Library WA does not accept items for Public Libraries directly from authors and/or publishers.

Information required by Westbooks, ALS & James Bennett includes:

- ISBN
- Full title – including any subtitle
- Author
- Editors
- Author biography – brief description of author and other works by author
- Country of Publication
- Publisher
- RRP
- Discount offered %
- Genre /Subject
- Format – paperback, hardback, etc
- Reader – Adult / Juvenile: if Juvenile, age range:
- Physical description – page count, illustrations, size (cm)
- Annotation – brief description of content
- Price – indicate if price is GST inclusive
- Contact information for orders – Name, phone, email and postal address
- Sample or colour cover image (jpg format)
- Short description of the book

Titles accepted by our suppliers must fit specified profiles for content and format. Not all titles can be accepted.

A special note for family history, local history and biography writers

The State Library of Western Australia collects a wide range of documents and images for the J S Battye Library of West Australian History, and you may have some treasures to contribute to these heritage collections.

Personal letters, diaries and photographs can provide a fascinating glimpse of the past and/or depict contemporary life in Western Australia. Copyright

Legal deposit is sometimes confused with copyright but they are not the same. Under the Copyright Act 1968 copyright protection is granted automatically in Australia from the moment a work is created. There are no formalities to be completed, such as registration and payment of fees.

ISBNs and ISSNs

The ISBN (International Standard Book Number and International Standard Serial Number) is a 13-digit number that uniquely identifies books and book-like products published internationally. Each number identifies a unique edition of a publication, from one specific publisher.

The State Library does not issue ISBNs or ISSNs, nor do we require you to have an ISBN or an ISSN to deposit a publication.

Prepublication Data Service

The Prepublication Data Service (formerly Cataloguing in Publication) is a free service offered by the National Library of Australia.

This service is for Australian publishers and self-publishing authors who want the details of their upcoming publications made available to Australian libraries, library suppliers, and other members of the book industry for acquisition purposes.
