EDUCATION AND LITERACY

Our Education and Literacy Fund supports literacy across the ages, including through our award-winning Better Beginnings program. Better Beginnings fosters the development of early childhood literacy through reading, talking, singing, drawing and playing sessions at our dedicated learning space for children, families, carers, and public libraries statewide. Literacy is a key criterion to successfully engage with society throughout life, and the State Library provides important resources for WA families in their children’s crucial first years.

The Education and Literacy Fund further supports our vast range of metro and regional primary and secondary school excursions and incursions which, coupled with our holiday programs and teacher classroom resources, provide an extensive range of literacy support. Our WACE Study Space provides a designated exam preparation space for secondary students and continues to be a popular resource for students preparing for their ‘big day’.

Your support of the Literacy and Education Fund will go to the heart of what we aim to achieve at the State Library, ensuring literacy and access to knowledge for all Western Australians. THOUGHT LEADERSHIP AND COLLECTIONS RESEARCH

Our Thought Leadership and Collections Research Fund places the State Library at the heart of a thoughtful dialogue with our times through interpretation and in-depth research into our State Library collections. It supports curated content for public talks, exhibitions, lectures and symposiums, and enables us to share WA stories with the rest of the world, saving them for future generations.

The Thought Leadership and Collections Research Fund contributes to a wide range of research projects in collaboration with local and national partners, including through our Researchers-in-Residence, who investigate our collections and make them readily accessible for the wider public. Together with our popular Fellowship program, this significantly improves public interaction with our collections, including through creative interpretation.

This in-depth research is supported by our ongoing partnerships with universities, cultural organisations and thought leaders nationally, which enhance the public conversation and academic dialogue in Western Australia through our participation in prestigious Australian Research Council (ARC) linkage projects.

Your support of the Thought Leadership and Research Fund will ensure a stimulating, thought-provoking interpretation of the State Library’s collections for the Western Australian public and provide you with enriching personal experiences to get up close and personal with the best minds in the State. It will strengthen the library sector’s status as a beacon of intellectual freedom and ask important questions at a time when they are more pertinent than ever.

COMMUNITIES AND ACCESS

Our Communities and Access Fund supports our engagement with WA’s diverse communities and their many significant stories. A third of WA’s population was born overseas and our work reflects the importance of these multicultural communities that make up our State.

Our highly popular adult English language and conversation classes, in addition to our Community Languages book collection comprised of over 40 different languages, continue to be popular resources. Our work with regional and remote communities is enriched through our partnership with the network of 233 public libraries across the State, ensuring equitable access for all Western Australians regardless of where they live.

The Communities and Access Fund also supports a wide range of measures to improve inclusion and access to our programs, such as the Auslan interpretation of our workshops and events, the creation of sensory storytelling experiences for those with neurodivergent needs and the subsidy of bus transportation for outer-metro schools who wish to come to the State Library.

Your support will break down the barriers to experiencing the power of knowledge and access to information. It will improve the sharing of our diverse communities’ stories and ensure we are able to ignite minds across the State, building brighter futures for all Western Australians.

ABORIGINAL EMPOWERMENT

Our Aboriginal Empowerment Fund supports our critical contribution to the state-wide conversation on truth-telling and reconciliation by strengthening and enabling Aboriginal-led perspectives. We aim to stimulate public dialogue and present contemporary perspectives through our Dialogues 2029 program of events, working in partnership with Aboriginal people to enable an enhanced understanding of who we are and where we come from, as we approach the bicentenary of Western Australia’s colonisation.

The Aboriginal Empowerment Fund supports Aboriginal self-determination by empowering Aboriginal peoples, families and communities to make decisions about their stories, recognising that our collections hold significant connection to country, culture and kinship. It fosters Aboriginal leadership, including through employment opportunities at the State Library, and supports culturally responsive, shared decision-making. The fund also supports Storylines, our award-winning Aboriginal family archive, as well as inclusive public library programming to increase engagement with local Aboriginal families and communities. Guided by their priorities, it also supports research into Aboriginal family histories and our Aboriginal collections, including music and oral histories.

Your support will strengthen the State Library in positioning itself at the nexus of an important state-wide dialogue with the oldest continuous culture on earth and share our learnings through public programming leading up to 2029.

WA FAMILY HISTORIES

Our WA Family Histories Fund supports your research into the ‘hatchings, matchings and dispatchings’ of your and other Western Australian families’ history. With the State Library holding an overwhelming amount of records, ephemera and collection items and providing a wide range of family research resources, we are the go-to for everyone wishing to dig deeper into family histories.

Our quarterly Family History Talks continue to be a popular starting point for many who wish to discover more about their family’s history. Our various digital research resources, including our Dead Reckoning WA Family History Research Guide, the Ancestry database, Find My Past and Trove, are complemented by the opportunity to look at original family material in our Leah Jane Cohen Reading Room.

The WA Family Histories Fund will support the extension of our research tools to databases that cover a wider geographical range, reflecting that a third of Western Australians and more than half of their parents were born overseas.

Your support can help unlock access to still unknown knowledge and help us deepen our understanding of where we are from. Depending on your individual circumstances and level of giving, we may also be able to assist with social opportunities to connect with wider family.
